Meggatt Peter	Andromeda	Warwick 1826 Arrest 1830	Life	17 1/2	3 "	Having been a long period in the Colony, and having given proof of reformation both before and since receiving a Conditional Pardon
Arnold John	Asia	1823 Leicester	Life	20 1/2	4 "	Having served so many Years in the Colony, and his Conduct having been Good, since he held a Conditional Pardon, and for some Years before.
Berkham William	Thames	1830 Leicester	Life	14 1/2	4 "	Having held a Conditional Pardon beyond the usual Period, and during his servitude in the Colony his Conduct having been Good.
Cordwell William	Clyde	Leicester 1830	Life	13 1/2	5 1/2 "	Having behaved well during his servitude in the Colony, and having held a Conditional Pardon beyond the usual time.
Edison Francis	Gov. Radey	1826 Middlesex	Life	17	4 "	Having completed beyond the usual servitude with a Conditional Pardon, and his Conduct having been Good for some Years past
